

UPDATE: TIMELY WARNING
Aggravated Sexual Assault
300 block of Lincoln
College Station, Texas

The College Station Police Department has released a composite sketch of the suspect in the recent aggravated sexual assault case. Both the College Station Police Department and the Brazos County District Attorney's Office have asked the university to share this information with the community.

Suspect is described as a 5'7" – 5'10" African American male with a medium build. He is also described as having a Nike type "swoosh" shaved into the side of his head and two lines shaved into each eye brow. He is also described as having extremely discolored and/or missing teeth and is known to wear a large cross around his neck that has clear type stones on it.

In light of the two sexual assaults involving violence in the past two weeks, the College Station Police Department and the Brazos County District Attorney's Office want to remind all citizens of some basic safety tips that can help keep you safe and may keep you from becoming a victim of crime.

In Your Home:

- Make sure all doors and windows are locked.
- Check all door locks each evening before you go to sleep.
- Make sure that all locks are functioning properly.
- Request a home security check from your local law enforcement agency.
- Leave lights on a timer if you plan to return home late in the evening.
- Meet your neighbors.
- Watch out for each other.
- Report all suspicious activity to local law enforcement immediately.
- If something is odd or out of the ordinary - please do not be afraid to call the police.
- Do not open your door for people that you do not know.

When Away From Your Home:

- Try to stay in well lit areas.
- When going to your vehicle, have your keys out and ready.

Be aware of your surroundings – look around.

If walking at night, try to walk with a friend or a group of people.

In social settings, do not leave your drink unattended.

Lock the doors in your vehicle when traveling, even if just around town.
